Subject access request – Data Protection Act 1998 (“the Act”)

We write further to your letter dated 22 February 2012 setting out your request for personal data, together with a postal order for £10.

Any personal data which we hold concerning you is held as data processor for our instructing solicitors, Harold G Walker Solicitors in respect of certain legal proceedings to which we understand you are a party.


Your request for personal data falls into one of the exempt categories set out in the Act and the Data Controller's (and thereafter the relevant processor's) legal privilege over such information is exerted. The information we hold has been requested by our instructing solicitors and for these reasons we are unable to disclose the information you have requested and such information is exempt from disclosure pursuant to Part 4, Sections 35(2)(a) and (b) and Schedule 7, Paragraph 10 of the Act.

As the information you have requested forms part of legal proceedings it would of course be open for you to make an application in those proceedings for disclosure of the same and to the extent that legal privilege did not apply to such information then it would appear that this would be disclosed to you as part of the legal proceedings.

We understand that you have solicitors instructed in respect of the relevant legal proceedings and we would recommend that you refer this matter to them, who may wish to take it up directly with our instructing solicitors.

In the meantime, please find enclosed your postal order for £10 duly returned.
